Billy M. Williams is the Executive Vice President for Ethics and Organizational Advancement at the American Geophysical Union (AGU), a global non-profit scientific society. Prior to joining AGU as Science Director in 2012, Williams served as a Senior Program Officer at the U.S. National Academy of Sciences and as a Global Research and Development Director at the Dow Chemical Company. While at Dow, he led global research teams with operations in France, Germany, Japan, and the U.S. While at the National Academies, he was study director for several important committees and resulting reports, including the report "National Security Implications of Climate Change for U.S. Naval Forces."



Williams was a member of the 2017-2018 National Academy of Sciences' Committee on Impact of Sexual Harassment in Academic Science Engineering and Medicine, and the 2019-2020 Committee on Increasing the Number of Women in STEMM. He has served as Principal Investigator on STEMM research grants from the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation, the Rockefeller Family Fund, and the U.S. National Science Foundation. He also co-led the development of the *Societies Consortium to End Harassment in STEMM*—an initiative to advance equity, excellence and integrity in the STEMM ecosystem, now with more than 100 scientific societies members. He has also served as Ethics Committee Chair for the American Society of Association Executives.

In addition to other scientific and organizational leadership responsibilities for AGU, Williams now coleads a global initiative to develop and gain global engagement on an ethical framework for climate intervention research.
