Role of Program Officers at US Science Agencies

- Design programs, make funding decisions
- Varies somewhat by agency, different structures (e.g., NSF vs. NIH)
- Usually Ph.D. scientists
- Function as scientist-administrators
- Well respected
- Heavy workload



Role of Program Officers at NSF

- Most are former researchers—many still do research
- May be a university rotator or permanent staff
- Identify new opportunities: design programs & help plan budgets
- Manage merit review process-make funding decisions

- Oversee current awards
- Suspend or terminate award for nonperformance (rarely)
- Sounding board and resource to proposers (pre-award)
- Sounding board and resource to PIs (during award)



Role of Program officers in FDP

- FDP Faculty Member "counterparts"
- See things from Federal AND scientist perspective
- Voice for "science first"
- Voice within agencies for new ideas— (example, new budget experiment being discussed at NSF)
- Welcome demonstrations that support better program management
