- No government funded framework for sustainable collaborations


We would like to propose the ideas from the Japanese and Mexican speakers who gave talks at the workshop today to both of the Japanese and Mexican government for the further development of the Nanobiology field as below:

- Holding regular workshops between the two countries
- Exchanging graduate students and postdoctoral fellows
- Organizing summer schools for young researchers
- Establishing a new joint-funding scheme for enhancing collaboration between researchers of the two countries
- Supporting joint research for researchers of both countries

Building a long-term cooperative framework between Japan and Mexico should be considered as an important factor for the further development of Science and Technology in and between both countries.
