What is Science Agora?

* Agora is ancient Greek for "meeting place"

Science Agora is an open forum for dialogue that brings together people from a variety of backgrounds, devoted to deepening the relationship between science and society.



Science Agora activities fulfill these five conditions:

With society and for society 2) Science related
 Self-motivated 4) Devoted to dialogue with a diverse range of people 5) Devoted to public dialogue



Science Agora is not only an academic conference of researchers, nor is it only an event for children. It focuses on "co-creation," bringing together diverse perspectives and setting all minds on the goal of creating a new and better future. Those participating in Science Agora are interested in co-creation through dialogue and collaboration among people from every walk of life, harnessing science and technology to make policy and creation knowledge.

For Contributors

Science Agora is a forum for communicating the interest and depth of their research or of science itself to the public. This is a forum for understanding how their research impacts and relates to society through dialogue with attendees.

For Attendees

Science Agora is a rare opportunity to hear the view of researchers and experts in person, and to express their hopes and dreams for science and technology and co-create the future.

Improvements from Science Agora 2020

All Live Broadcasts via Zoom

Zoom will be the only live broadcast format offered to avoid splitting attendees. Sessions with over 1,000 pre-registrants will be handled on a case-by-case basis. Please inform the Science Agora Secretariat in your application if you would like to broadcast via YouTube Live.

Post-Session Online Dialogue

In response to the request to offer casual dialogue between the contributors and attendees, we have scheduled a 30minute dialogue time after the session. Please use this time to discuss your vision of the future, or the themes offered by Science Agora, with audience members.

- 2. <u>Contributors will submit a session report to the Science</u> <u>Agora Secretariat that can be published</u> online within three days of their session
- 3. <u>Contributors will promote and solicit attendees for their</u> <u>session</u> (The Science Agora Secretariat will provide an early sign-up system, but the contributor is responsible for promotion. Science Agora will support promotion of the session through retweeting from the official account and other activities)
- 4. <u>The contributor agrees to use the Science Agora Zoom</u> <u>account</u> for live broadcast, <u>and to have the video made</u> <u>available through YouTube after the event</u>. (The publication period will be at least one year. Please inquire regarding the recording of videos that feature or are produced by minors.)

Application Review Perspectives

- 1. Is the application designed to envision the future or discussion challenges with attendees?
- 2. Are innovations done to promote dialogue and gather insights from attendees?
- 3. Does the application consider what can be shared with attendees, and what can be gained from dialogue?
- 4. Is the application, including schedule and materials, welldesigned? Does it consider attendees of differing interests?
- 5. Does the application have a plan for promotion to its target demographic?

Session applications will be reviewed based on the above criteria based on the information in the application form. Acceptance or rejection results will be shared via email, together with any comments from the Committee.

Applications highly rated by the Committee may be selected as highlight sessions. Highlight sessions will receive preferential promotion on the official website and other venues.

Highlight sessions scheduled on weekdays can use the BASE Q broadcast studio. Please note this applies to pre-recorded videos only. No venue fee required, but approximately 20,000JPY may be required for audio and lighting operators and other expenses.

Application Process

Applications are accepted via the online application form. Please access the form from the official Science Agora website:

1.) Obtain application login ID

Please register a contributor account for communication with the Science Agora Secretariat. Communications will be sent to the email address registered with the login ID. Applications who have exhibited or presented at Science Agora since 2015 may reuse the same ID. If you have forgotten your ID, please register a new one.

You must register one ID for each simultaneous session application

Example: Applying for two sessions requires two login IDs

2.) Submit application

Please press the "Send" button after filling out the application form from "My Page." We recommend reviewing and saving the application materials ahead of starting the form. Application details may be reviewed and edited in the system up to the application deadline. The application system does not allow the details to be edited or viewed after the deadline, so please save them offline for reference.

What sets apart a successful, highly attended presentation? Fun, useful & effective! Presentation tips and techniques

Science Agora has created a compilation of important points to bear in mind from design to implementation of your presentation, based on analysis of successful Science Agora 2020 presentations.

Some points apply after your presentation is accepted, but considering the entire process at application time will help ensure a successful presentation.



Determine session Goals

Your organization's core activities will form the foundation of your session. Carefully review whether you can make a presentation that incorporates the Science Agora theme "Dialogue for Life." Also, be aware of the mission to inspire your attendees (viewers) to share their insights for our future society through your presentation.

What actions and dialogue do you need to achieve the goals of your organization's activities?

- How can presenting at Science Agora help achieve your goals?
- ✓ Is presenting at Science Agora effective for achieving your goals?
- ✓ What would you like to discuss and create with your attendees?



Arrange Your Speakers

Have you chosen speakers who can discuss your presentation theme with your attendees? Please ensure you create an atmosphere that welcomes many opinions.

- Have you chosen effective, motivated speakers for your presentation? (Specialty balance)
- ✓ Have you considered gender and age balance? (Ensure balance or purposely unbalance?)
- Will a single facilitator drive the presentation, or will they work with the speakers? (The facilitator plays an critical role in Zoom sessions)
- Please ensure your speakers present in an easy-tounderstand manner for attendees outside your field of specialty, and that your supporting materials have appropriate explanations and supporting graphics. Also, please ensure your materials adhere to copyright laws.



Create Your Story

How will you drive your presentation to keep your attendees engaged and not leave them behind? Creating a story with a classic "awaken, expand, surprise, and conclude" structure is one effective method.

Awaken

Does your presentation have an impactful opening?

What question or vision of the future will you pose?

Expand

Expand your presentation points? Have a group work session?

Surprise

Will free dialogue lead to unexpected insights?

Are you facilitating new discoveries?

Conclude

How will you summarize the insights gained from the session, and your plans for future development? What will the attendees take home?



Review your Presentation Design

Think about your presentation schedule to avoid running out of time at the end of 90 minutes.

- ✓ Do your speakers have the right amount of time? Giving less than 10 minutes makes their portion hard to understand, but attendees can get bored if portions last over 20 minutes
- ✓ How and when will you facilitate dialogue?
- ✓ Have you considered the different ways people will attend? Some will join by smartphone, others by PC.
 Do you mind if people listen while doing something else, or do you want them fully engaged?
- ✓ Review the list of convenient tools (slide 38) for anything you can use



Promote to Your Target Demographic

Your independent promotion plan is part of the application review criteria. A well-made notification and promotion campaign is essential to attract many attendees to your presentation. Please carefully review what sort of promotion will be effective with your target demographic. Below are some techniques that have worked well for past presentations.

- 1. Deliver fliers to related organizations: Produce your own fliers and deliver them to public organizations and local municipal offices. Also send your fliers directly to researchers and others in related fields
- 2. Request organizations to contact their mailing lists and post on their websites: Search for websites related to your presentation, and ask your speakers for promising leads for promotion, and follow-up directly
- 3. Publish on websites and social media: Promote on your own websites and social media, and request your speakers to also post notifications



Rehearse

Even if your organization is accustomed to presenting, it may be new for your speakers. Also please check that your presentation is easy to understand from the perspective of attendees.

- ✓ Confirm your Internet connection. Please perform your presentation with stable Wi-Fi or a wired LAN connection
- ✓ Confirm the activities of the presentation staff: The facilitator, staff who will manage the materials shown on screen, assistants who will manage Q&A with attendees, etc. Please confirm all relevant logistics with your staff
- ✓ Please also consider your post-presentation report



Present

The true value of presenting at Science Agora comes from hearing a diverse range of voices from around the world. Please consider how you will hold effective dialogue with people with views that differ from your own.

- ✓ Opinions different than our own expand our perspective.
 Please do not discard different opinions
- ✓ There is no shame in changing your own opinions after understanding a different point of view
- ✓ Please ensure no single person speaks excessively
- ✓ Society is not built simply by the majority opinion, the minority opinion also offers important insights



Look Back and Review

Please look back and review your presentation with your speakers. Consider your post-presentation survey, the reaction on the day, where you succeeded and where there was room for improvement. Leverage the insights gained for your future activities.

- ✓ Did the presentation proceed well?
- ✓ Did you effectively integrate the views of your attendees? What did you learn from their participation?
- The Science Agora Secretariat would love to hear if any new insights or encounters look like they will lead to new developments or projects at your organization

Column Facts Regarding Participation Rates

Average online event participation rate: 30~40%

Science Agora enjoys extremely high participation rates of 80%-90% of pre-registrants for its live, in-person events. The online <u>Science Agora 2020, however, only achieved a participation rate of 30% of pre-registrants, no different than usual online Zoom events.</u> It is essential that presenters carry out effective online and social media promotion campaigns to build a large base of registrants and create anticipation to avoid same-day cancellations and reduce the overall cancellation rate to the greatest extent possible.
